She successfully lobbied in 1994 for Australia's Breast Cancer Day, and was instrumental in the establishment of the National Breast Cancer Centre for education and policy in breast cancer. Linda's primary research interests are in the areas of informed decision making and self perceptions in women with breast cancer. In 1997 her advocacy was rewarded with the award of an OAM. This was upgraded to AM in 2006 for research and promotion. She assures us that her talk will be of equal interest to men and women.
